*THE NICENE CREED

People: Let us keep the feast.


DISTRIBUTION

Hold out your hands and wheat bread will be placed in your hand. For rice bread, please take it yourself. You may eat the bread and move to the cup of wine to drink or dip your bread before eating, or move to the cup of juice and dip your bread. Those unable to come forward will be served in their pews.
