





Cover Art

Today's cover art, "The Calling of James and John," is by an unknown artist from the School of Bellini; possibly even Bellini himself. It is from the 15-16th century, and is on display in the Museo Civici, Padua. It is more than likely the model for the kneeling figure, intending one of the disciples, was the the individual who commissioned the work. Artists frequently paint themselves or loved ones into their works. As readers of scripture, it can be a helpful exercise to consider where we see ourselves in each story, or how our understanding of the story changes as we view it from the perspective of different biblical characters.
