The Saint Andrew Music Society's *Music on Madison* season continues today at 3 pm. In celebration of Women's History Month, the Neave Piano Trio will perform works by four distinguished women composers spanning the Romantic era through the modern day, including Rebecca Clarke's *Piano Trio*; Amy Beach's *Piano Trio in A minor*, Op. 150; Cécile Chaminade's *Piano Trio No. 1*, Op. 11; and Jennifer Higdon's *Piano Trio*. Since forming in 2010, the Neave Trio – violinist Anna Williams, cellist Mikhail Veselov, and pianist Eri Nakamura – has earned enormous praise for its engaging, cutting-edge performances.
