we cannot open our hands to receive blessings from above.


Deal with us not as we deserve, but according to your mercy;

Saint Andrew Chorale & Orchestra: Works by Britten and Vaughan Williams Today at 3 pm, the Saint Andrew Chorale and Orchestra, along with 80 singers from our New York City Children's Chorus, will perform two major works composed in England during the early 20th century. Vaughan Williams considered his *Sancta Civitas* (The Holy City) to be his favorite large choral work, written for double chorus, children's chorus, soloists and orchestra, based on texts he selected from the book of Revelation. Benjamin Britten's *The World of the Spirit* for chorus, soloists, narrators, and orchestra is a piece of similarly large proportions. Admission is \$30 (\$25 – students/seniors 62+); Children 12 & under are free.
