



American poet Mary Oliver (1935-2019) was an "indefatigable guide to the natural world," wrote Maxine Kumin in the *Women's Review of Books*, "particularly to its lesser-known aspects." She continued: "Oliver stands quite comfortably on the margins of things, on the thin line that separates human from what we loosely call animal." Oliver's poetry won numerous awards, including the Pulitzer Prize, the National Book Award, and a Lannan Literary Award for Lifetime Achievement. In the cover poem, she writes of the donkey's inevitable journey, which, of course, mimics Christ's own.
