About Our Guest Preacher

The Rev. Brian D. Ellison has served as Executive Director of the Covenant Network since 2012, preaching, teaching and providing overall strategic leadership in implementing the organization's mission. Previously, he served as pastor of Parkville Presbyterian Church (near Kansas City, Missouri) for 13 years. Brian currently serves the General Assembly as a member of its Permanent Judicial Commission; he previously was a director of the Board of Pensions, a member of the Committee on the Office of the General Assembly, and moderator of both the Committee on Mission Responsibility Through Investment and the Stated Clerk Review/Nomination Committee. He is Associate Stated Clerk of the Synod of Mid-America and has also served as Stated Clerk of Heartland Presbytery. A graduate of Harvard University and Princeton Theological Seminary, Brian also is host/contributor at NPR affiliate KCUR-FM. He and his partner, Troy Lillebo, live in Kansas City. In 1999, Brian was MAPC's David H. C. Read Scholar. Due to renovations in the sanctuary at the time, he preached in the gymnasium. He looks forward to preaching from the pulpit this week!
