This is our annual reminder of the IRS rules concerning yearend contributions of cash and securities. In general, the deliverv date determines the year in which a contribution can be claimed as a deduction. Checks mailed with a postmark of December 31, 2017 or earlier, or hand-delivered by December 31, 2017, will be credited as a contribution in 2017. Please note: The Church House and Business Office will close at 1 pm on December 29! Please contact our business manager, Richard Frey, by December 29, if you wish to make a contribution or

need assistance in making one. After January 1, 2018, contributions will be credited as contributions for 2018.

For gifts of securities, the date of mailing is the delivery date; if hand-delivered, the date of receipt by the charity is the delivery date. When securities are delivered from a donor's bank or broker, the delivery date is the date the securities are transferred to the charity.

The Church Business Office can assist you in making yearend gifts of securities by using its account with Merrill Lynch.
