## **A Note From Jenny**

It has been an eventful week at MAPC. Our sprinkler installation and other scheduled projects continue on as anticipated. However, on Monday evening, a water line's valve failure resulted in significant flooding on floors 4 through 10 of the Church House. We have taken swift measures to both repair damages and prevent mold (and other allergen concerns). The Trustees and the Session have been kept informed every step of the way, with members of the Building and Grounds Subcommittee, in particular, lending expertise and insight. I am deeply grateful for their generous sharing of their time and talent, especially with very little notice.

Our primary concern is repair of our building, particularly staff apartments and the Day School. Roger Pierce, our Director of Administration & Finance, is working closely with contractors, insurance adjusters, and everyone in between. I am grateful for his dedication to his work, and the positive spirit he maintains even in difficult circumstances.

Fortunately, neither the Sanctuary nor the Phillips Building took on any water.

As we navigate these repairs, I ask the following of you:

- Keep MAPC, and all contractors and construction workers, in your prayers, for continued (and safe) progress.
- Extend grace toward church staff. They are working very hard under less than ideal circumstances.
- If you are looking for a way to help, for now, consider sharing an expression of gratitude in whatever form you wish—kind words or notes go a long way. If and when there are ways for the congregation to help, we will let you know. For now, we need to let the professionals do their work.

I am glad to welcome Rev. Beverly Dempsey to MAPC this Sunday. Beverly is known to many at MAPC and currently serves at Jan Hus Presbyterian Church and Neighborhood House. I will miss being with you, but I will be away for an exciting reason. Our new pastoral resident, Rebecca Heilman, will be ordained Sunday at her home church in Valdeze, North Carolina. She invited me to preach at the service and I am honored to do so. Rebecca will be with us in worship beginning August 26—be sure to introduce yourself!

As summer wraps up, even with some unexpected challenges, I am so grateful to be here. I am excited for all the fall has in store, beginning with September 9! Don't miss out on opportunities to grow in faith, make new friends, and dive deeper into all MAPC has to offer.
